More information on the project will be presented to the communities via open house and information sessions in the coming months. No action needed by the board.

Mark Mainelli, Highway Superintendent, joined the meeting.

Jarod Dendinger and Ed Knott, representatives of Applied Connective Technologies LLC, joined the meeting. Discussion held on the Email, Cyber and IT Services outlines received. Outlined were: Microsoft 365 and Exchange email services; Endpoint Management and Protection; Contract IT and Technical Services; and General Projects and Best Practices. The estimated costs of the services were discussed with the representatives. Mr. Dendinger advised the board that they currently provide IT services to approximately 40 counties within the State of Nebraska. Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Rehak to approve the following utility permits to construct fiber optic lines along 845 and 846 Rds and 559, 560 and 561 Aves in Stanton County contingent on the payment of the \$500 permit fees and submission of a certificate of liability for the construction company and subject to requirements and provisions of the permit and with the following conditions: 1) the fiber line should be placed on the edge of the road (halfway between the edge of the road and the middle of the road), 2) the road needs to be returned to its original condition or the cost for repairs to fix the damages will be billed to the applicant, 3) if additional gravel is needed on the road after construction the costs may be charged to the applicant, 4) all culverts are to be bored under, not cut through, and 5) contact Darrell Hansen, bridge foreman, prior to beginning to be certain all culverts have been flagged and with any questions, or concerns.
