John Brandow, Stanton Nursing Home administrator, and Kathy Moore, Nursing Home Board president, appeared before the board to discuss the American Rescue Plan Act (ARPA) funds received by the county from the federal government. Mr. Brandow presented an overview of the services provided by the Stanton Health Center. The Stanton Health Center is in need of financial aid due to the loss of revenue and increase of expenses. The Health Center is requesting \$500,000.00 of the ARPA funds to alleviate the economic loss and expense created by the COVID-19 pandemic. Discussion held on the regulations and guidelines that will need to be established before awarding any funds. No action taken on the request at this time.

Mike Frohberg, Emergency Manager, and Ryan Wehrle, Maintenance/Custodian, joined the meeting. Mike presented a request received from the Sanitary and Improvement District No. 1 for ARPA funds to purchase a generator in the approximate amount of \$24,586.00 plus undetermined cost for fencing, concrete and labor. The generator would control the wells for Woodland Park and garage door access to emergency equipment in case of a power outage, if needed. Discussion held on the regulations and guidelines that will need to be established before awarding any funds. No action taken on the request at this time.

Mike updated the board on the generator for the communication tower. The original grant had requested a 60kW generator and Mike is going to submit a new request for a 30kW generator. The original grant awarded was in the amount of \$43,500.00. Formal quotes for the generator and installation needed before March 31st and decision determined on April 18, 2022.

Mike Unger, County Sheriff, joined the meeting. Discussion held on the fleet vehicles for the sheriff office, options for trade-in and replacement.

Bid letting was held on the removal and repairs to the courthouse parking lot, etc and the installation of a handicap walkway. Ryan Wehrle appeared for the bid letting. Concrete Bids were opened and publicly read from Laser Pro, Platte Center Nebraska and KV Quality Construction Inc, Clarkson Nebraska. Discussion held on the comparison of the bids received and the option to obtain a comparable quote of the proposed area from KV Quality Construction. The board requested Ryan to obtain a comparable site quote from KV Quality Construction.

There is 1 fracture critical structure due for inspection, 83 routine inspections and 1 non-Fracture Critical bridge due for inspection. For these inspections Mainelli Wagner & Associates proposes to provide the following services, including: 1) Routine inspections for 85 structures (per the most recent BrM data); 2) Taking site photographs as required by NDOT; 3) Inputting data into the BrM Program; 4) Generating a maintenance report for the County's use; 5) Labeling all pictures per the NDOT naming convention; 6) Submitting pictures and data to NDOT; 7) Submit disk with any Special Inspection report, Critical Findings Reports and pictures to County; and 8) Submit file with updated SIA sheets for all structures inspected. The rate for the routine inspections per bridge will be \$145.00 (84) and the rate for the fracture critical inspection will be \$1,870.00 (1).

Whereas: The State has completed the required NEPA document, along with resource agency concurrences, and right of way (RWO) was needed for completing permanent repairs; and

Whereas: All emergency repairs were completed within 180 days and are eligible for 100% federal reimbursement; and

Whereas: The total emergency repairs reimbursement is \$127,196.49 and no further costs relating to this project will be incurred or submitted to the State.

Whereas: The total permanent repairs reimbursement is \$1,570,054.71 and no further costs relating to this project will be incurred or submitted to the State.
