LaLene Bates and Scott Henrickson joined the meeting to update the county board on the Stanton County Veterans Memorial park. Also joining the meeting was Mike Daugherty of Array Environmental Inc. Scott presented a revised map layout for the park. Discussion was held on the revised layout, necessary dirt work needed before construction and construction outline (timeframe). Mr. Daugherty informed the county board of the location of current well monitors and possible future monitor sites on the park site. Any new monitor sites will be installed in conjunction with the dirt work. No action needed by the board.

Kylee Klug, Planning and Zoning Administrator, joined the meeting.

Chairman Kment open the hearing at 9:30 AM on the Residential Use Permit (RUP) application of Cynthia Oltmer to construct a residence on property located in the W½ SE 32-22-1. Cindy Oltmer and Ben Oltmer appeared for the hearing. Kylee explained the application and recommendations of the Planning Commission. Discussion was held on the site and conditions approved by the Planning Commission.

Kylee updated the board on a complaint received about dirt/silt runoff onto private property. The CUP applicant is required to control runoff. Aerial pictures were reviewed of the runoff. Discussion held on the issue. The county board suggested Kylee contact the applicant about the issue.

Twelve (12) members of the public appeared to continue the discussion on the noise being generated near and/or around the JigoWatt Modular Data Center located in pt NE SE 36-24-1. Comments were made on the zoning regulations, the planning zoning hearings, and the building permit conditions. It was suggested to keep in contact with the data site about mitigating the noise and working together. The goal is to ensure compliance with the building permit conditions. It was suggested to allow 90 days for some type of modification/change to the current operational equipment of JigoWatt.

Dick Johnson, representative of Mainelli Wagner and Assoc, joined the meeting. Dick advised the county board the contracts have been mailed to Cech Excavating for the FEMA project. Discussion was held on road projects.

Mike Frohberg, emergency manager, joined the meeting.

Discussion was held on the south shop underground tanks. An inspection by the Nebraska Fire Marshall indicated a release of petroleum. Mike informed the board that all the dispensers for the underground tanks will be replaced. He stated that Terracon has been contacted to plan a process to monitor ground water contamination.

Discussion continued on the electrical upgrade and replacement of the doors to the Stanton shop building. The electrical needs to be updated to handle the higher electrical demand and install additional exterior lights. Mike presented the following quotes for the electrical update: Lingenfelter Electric, Battle Creek NE – \$39,810.00; Frohberg Electric Co, Norfolk NE – \$48,500.00; Stamm Electric, Stanton NE – no quote received. The board reviewed the quotes.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Kment to accept the quote of Lingenfelter Electric of Battle Creek NE in the amount of \$39,810.00 for the electrical upgrade at the Stanton shop building. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Kment and Rehak. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Bid letting set for August 19, 2024 at 10:00AM for removal/disposal and replacement of the overhead doors on the Stanton shop building.

Mike informed the county board of NEMA updates in reference to the EMPG reimbursement funds, county disaster declarations, roles and responsibilities of elected officials and damage assessment tools. Mike stated the EMA county website is on line (www.stantoncountyma.gov) and informed the county board that a Cyclone Port weather station is being installed on the county tower. Mike continues to work on the hazard mitigation projects. An MOU was entered into between Stanton County EMA/Stanton County and Madison County Sheriff/Madison Police Department for assistance during the Madison County Fair. Mike informed the county board that a generator and other equipment was received from the Nebraska Forestry Service for the Mass Casualty Trailer.

Mike Unger, county sheriff, and Tyler Evans, deputy sheriff, joined the meeting.

Discussion was held on the hourly rates/wages of the various offices/departments.

The board received a thank you from the Pilger Public Library Board and the Stanton Public Library Board for the continued support of the county and are requesting funding for the 2024-2025 fiscal year. Consensus of the board is to continue the \$5,000.00 allotment to the Pilger Library and the \$5,000.00 allotment to the Stanton Library for the fiscal year 2024-2025.

Discussion was held on the hourly rates/wages of the various offices/departments. An increase of 50¢ per hour would increase an annual wage by approximately \$1,040.00. Discussion was held on an annual wage increase of \$1,250.00 for the emergency manager.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Rehak to increase the hourly rate for the Veterans' Service Officer and Planning Zoning Administrator to \$28.50 per hour, the Custodian/Maintenance to \$24.50 per hour, the road department employees to \$23.50 per hour (non CDL employees \$22.50), the Bridge Foreman to \$25.50 per hour and increase the annual salary for the Emergency Manager to \$66,250.00 effective July 1, 2024. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Rehak and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mike addressed the county board on the budget documents submitted by his department. Mike noted the increase in the sheriff budget was to cover the cost of pay raises given last fiscal year and asked if \$20,000.00 could be added to the deputy line item for possible wage increases and overtime for unforeseen incidents. He stated that the additional amount could be removed from the jail fund due to the decrease in boarding in the last fiscal year. The consensus of the county board was to allow Mike to adjust his budget request.
