COMMISSIONER’S PROCEEDINGS – April 20, 2026

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Stanton County, Nebraska was held in an open and public session on April 20, 2026, at 8:15 AM in the County Commissioner’s room in Stanton, Nebraska.

Present upon the roll call were Douglas Huttman, Dennis Kment and Douglas Oertwich, Board of Commissioners. Wanda Heermann, County Clerk, was also present.

Advance notice of the meeting was given by publication in the Stanton Register on April 8, 2026, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes, and by posting on the county website.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance to the Board members, a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda being attached to these minutes.

All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America the meeting was called to order at 8:15 AM by Chairman Kment, who announced that the open meetings act is posted on the wall in the Commissioner’s room and a copy may be obtained from the County Clerk’s office upon request.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve the agenda. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve the minutes of the March 16, 2026, meeting. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The following correspondence was reviewed and placed on file: Men’s Health Network – information; Marx Dust control – service flyer; Scott Wheeler, Tallahassee FL – request support letter Lawrence Welk; Road Groom Mfg – equipment flyer; NENEDD – Thank You continued support; International Cornhusker – information postcard.

Jeff Hansen joined the meeting to discuss the duties and requirements of the Weed Superintendent. Jeff accepted the position after the March 16, 2026, meeting and attended the Weed Superintendent workshop held in Kearney March 31 through April 2, 2026. Discussion was held on duties of the position, reports and notices required to be filed with the State and the procedure to review areas of possible infestation and notices to landowners. Also discussed was the need to set up a new email address, purchase of a laptop computer for record keeping and time sheet and compensation as weed superintendent (annual salary \$12,000.00 – payable \$1,000.00 monthly).

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to officially appoint Jeff Hansen as the Weed Superintendent for Stanton County beginning April 1, 2026. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Clyde Lee Renn appeared before the county board to interview for the custodian/maintenance position. The county board reviewed the employment application with Mr. Renn. A discussion was held on qualifications, experience, duties of the position, hours and wages. The county board offered the position to Lee. Lee advised the county board he would think about the offer and make a decision after talking to his current employer.

W. Bert Lammler, county attorney, joined the meeting.

LaLene Bates and Scott Henrickson joined the meeting to update the county board on the Stanton County Veterans’ Memorial Park. A discussion was held on the sprinkler lines, electrical lines and the sod to be placed in early May. Also discussed was a security surveillance system for the park. Scott presented quotes received from H&H Construction & Supply, Priority Communications, Norfolk

Computer Solutions, and AI camera quote. The county board requested additional information on the cameras quoted by Priority Communications. Matter set aside until Scott can acquire the additional information.

A discussion was held on a board of health situation within Stanton County. Mr. Lampli advised the county board of the incident involving animals removed from a residence and grounds located on the edge of the Village of Pilger. Mr. Lampli stated the animals were taken to the Humane Society in Omaha and there will be a cost of housing these animals which will be the responsibility of the county.

Kylee Klug, planning and zoning administrator, joined the meeting.

The chairman opened the hearing at 9:35 AM on the Conditional Use Permit application of KGI Wireless on behalf of Verizon Wireless to erect a telecommunications tower on property located in the S½ SE 14-23-3. Appearing for the hearing were: Emily Milewski, representative of Verizon, Chris Munson, representative of KGI Wireless, and Leonard Jindra. Kylee explained the application, indicated tower guidelines and setbacks have been met, the proposed site location of the tower is not located in the floodplain, and the site access has been approved by the Stanton County Road Engineer. Kylee reviewed with the county board the conditions recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission voting 5 in favor, 2 against and 2 absent. Emily Milewski indicated that there is a 30 year lease with the landowners for the proposed site. Leonard Jindra spoke against the construction of the tower on property located next to his property which has a residence near the property line. He stated that there could be a magnetic interference with modern farm equipment, interference with GPS systems in the area, interference with business band radios, the constant blinking lights on the tower and loss of value to his property because of the tower in the area.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to close the hearing. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve the Conditional Use Permit application of KGI Wireless on behalf of Verizon Wireless to erect a telecommunications tower on property located in the S½ SE 14-23-3, as per Planning Commission recommendations. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mr. Jindra requested a certified copy of the hearing minutes.

Ramsy Robertson, representative of Mainelli Wagner Assoc, joined the meeting.

The chairman opened the hearing at 9:55 AM to consider the recommendations of the Stanton County Planning Commission on the Amendment to the Zoning Matrix, Section 4.07 Land Use Categories table and consideration of the addition of Accessory Dwelling Units in the Stanton County Zoning Regulations, Stanton County Nebraska. The purpose of the hearing is to receive public comments and input from the general public. Advance notice of the hearing was given by publication in the Stanton Register on April 1, 2026. No members of the public appeared.

Kylee presented and explained the updates and changes to the Comprehensive Plan and Zoning Matrix – Section 4.07 Land Use Categories Table, Stanton County Zoning Regulations, Stanton County Nebraska. The Planning Commission recommended the following change: Accessory Dwelling Units to be added as a Conditional Use in Zones A-1, A-2, TA-1, RPC-1, R-1, LSR-1, C-1, I-1 and I-2 but not permitted in Zone RM because the typical lot size in RM (Mobile Home District) would not be adequate for a secondary dwelling, currently Stanton County does not have an RM District established. A discussion was held on the definitions relating to Accessory Dwellings Units and Accessory Living Quarters. Kylee reviewed the conditions approved by the Planning Commission and made reference to condition 9: accessory dwelling must share utilities with the principal dwelling and condition 6: accessory dwelling must share the same address with the principal dwelling. Discussion was held on the square footage cap described in condition 2.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to close the hearing. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve Resolution No. 2026.04-6 as presented, approving the amendments to the Zoning Matrix, Section 4.07: Land Use Categories Table and the Addition of Accessory Dwelling Units in the Stanton County Zoning Regulations, Stanton County Nebraska. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Kylee presented the Field of Flags Lot Split splitting property located in the SE 35-22-3 into 4 lots (lot 1 is 6.12 acres, lot 2 is 0.50 acres (an unbuildable lot), lot 3 is approximately 33.88 acres and lot 4 is approximately 76.06 acres). No one appeared for the lot split. Kylee explained the reason for the lot split.

Motion made by Kment, seconded by Huttman to approve the Field of Flags Lot Split splitting property located in the SE 35-22-3 into 4 lots (lot 1 is 6.12 acres, lot 2 is 0.50 acres (an unbuildable lot), lot 3 is approximately 33.88 acres and lot 4 is approximately 76.06 acres), as per Planning Commission recommendations. Voting: Ayes: Kment, Huttman and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Discussion was held on the Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way received from Nebraska Public Power District with a fiber optic line along 559 Ave, running south 1 mile between sections 5/6-2401 and then along 845 Rd, running west approximately 1/3 mile between sections 6/7-24-1. Steve Kroll, representative of RVW Inc, appeared and explained the permit. Ramsy reviewed the permit diagrams with the county board.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve Utility Permit No. 20260420-01 received from Nebraska Public Power District with a fiber optic line along 559 Ave, running south 1 mile between sections 5/6-24-1 and then along 845 Rd, running west approximately 1/3 mile between sections 6/7-24-1, subject to the requirements and provision of the permit and with the following conditions: 1) only allows authority on Stanton County ROW, 2) permit contingent on requirements listed in Appendix "A", 3) the fiber line needs to be placed as far away as possible from the road, not placed in any road, 4) all roads and/or culverts are to be bored under, not cut through, 5) the fiber line should be 4' (four feet) below the surface and 4' (four feet) below any culvert, 6) all roads need to be returned to their original condition if damaged or the cost for repair to fix the damages will be billed to the applicant, 7) if additional gravel is needed after construction the costs will be charged to the applicant, and 8) contact Darrell Hansen, bridge foreman, prior to beginning to be certain all culverts have been flagged and with any questions or concerns. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Gravel bid letting was held at 10:30 AM. No appearances were made. The chairman opened the sealed bids and read them aloud. Bids were received from the following: Matteo Sand & Gravel, Norfolk NE – \$ 21.00 per ton – road gravel, armor coat; Backus Sand & Gravel, McLean NE – \$ 20.50 per ton – road gravel, armor coat. No other bids were received. Discussion was held on the bids received and gravel availability from other local gravel pits.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to accept the bids and to purchase gravel at the pits with the lowest price and where hauling is the most economical and to purchase delivered gravel at the pits where it is available at the lowest price. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The board reviewed the 2026 Routine and Fracture Critical (NSTM) Bridge Inspection information received from Mainelli Wagner & Associates Inc. For 2026, there are 82 routine inspections due: 33 of these are culverts (CBC or CMP) and 4 are closed bridges. The remaining 45 are open bridges (steel girder, timber girder, concrete girder or concrete slab). There are also 2 NSTM (FC) bridge inspections due in 2026. Mainelli Wagner & Associates proposes to provide the following services, including: 1. Routine or NSTM

Routine inspections for all structures that require a 2026 inspection; 2. Special Inspection for bridges that require a 2026 special inspection; 3. Taking site photographs as required by NDOT; 4. Inputting data into the BrM program; 5. Generating a maintenance report for the County's use; 6. Labeling all pictures per the NDOT naming convention; 7. Submitting pictures and data to NDOT; 8. Submit disk with any Special Inspection reports, Critical Findings Reports and pictures to County; 9. Update the BrM and complete inspections in conformance with new SNBI requirements. These services will be provided for a lump sum fee of \$9,200.00.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve the 2026 Routine and Fracture Critical (NSTM) Bridge Inspection for a lump sum fee of \$9,200.00 and authorize the chairman to sign the approval form. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the Petition to vacate/close a county road located the NE 16-22-2 received from Michael Wilke. A discussion was held on the road(s) indicated with Ramsy.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve Resolution No. 2026.04-7 to direct a study by the County Highway Superintendent of county road No. 149 and No. 55 located in NE 16-22-2. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

One and Six Year Plan hearing set for May 18, 2026, at 10:45 AM.

Ramsy updated the county board on the various bridge and culvert projects within the county. Discussion was also held on possible armor coat projects.

Discussion was held on the possible sale of county property located in Pt SW 24-23-3 (Kingsburg Precinct). The county board shall hold an open and public hearing prior to any sale or lease of property at which time any interested party may appear and speak for or against the sale or lease of county property.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve Resolution No. 2026.04-10 to schedule a public hearing on May 18, 2026 10:00 AM on the sale of real estate located in Pt W $\frac{1}{2}$ SW 24-23-3 owned by Stanton County, Nebraska. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Kment to approve Resolution No. 2026.04-8 to add pledged security at Stanton State Bank, Stanton Nebraska. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Kment and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Kment to approve Resolution No. 2026.04-9 to release pledged security at Stanton State Bank, Stanton Nebraska. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Kment and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Scott Henrickson rejoined the meeting. He presented the additional information as to the type of camera on the Priority Communications quote. The county board reviewed the information.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to accept the quote of Priority Communications & Solutions Inc of Battle Creek Nebraska for the installation of a security system for the Veterans' Memorial Park in the approximate cost of \$1,191.37. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mike Frohberg, emergency manager, joined the meeting. Mike presented a Request for Planned Events regarding a formal request for our services, equipment, and other resources for events (county fairs, concerts, or events), if needed. The MOU was signed by Gina Uhing of Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health Department, Dennis Kment, Stanton County Commissioner, and Mike Frohberg, Stanton County Emergency Management. Mike informed the county board that the Elkhorn Logan Valley Public Health Department has requested to use the Rapid Response and Command Trailer during the 2026 Big Bang Boom celebration in Norfolk as a first aid station. The trailer will also be utilized as an incident command post for emergency services.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve and authorize the chairman to sign the formal request of the Stanton County Rapid Response and Command Trailer during the 2026 Big Bang Boom celebration in Norfolk. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Lee Renn rejoined the meeting. He accepted the position for custodian/maintenance offered by the county board. Lee also advised the county board he would start May 11, 2026, due to prior obligations at his current employment.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to hire Lee Renn for the custodian/maintenance position, 35-40 hours per week, and starting wage of \$26.00 per hour. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

A discussion was held on the lawn maintenance. Lee advised the county board he would begin mowing in the evenings prior to his May start date.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to authorize Lee to begin mowing the courthouse lawn prior to his May start date. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Three quotes were received as requested by the county board for the Courthouse/Veterans' Park grounds mowing. Since the hiring of Lee Renn, the service for mowing is no longer needed. The county board requested the county clerk to notify the individuals who submitted quotes that the mowing will be done by our new custodian/maintenance personnel.

The Stanton County Audited Financial Statement for the year ending June 30, 2025, was received from MDT LLC and a copy submitted to the Nebraska State Auditor's office. A copy was given to the Board of Commissioners to review. Discussion was held on the audit findings.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve and place on file the year ending June 30, 2025 audit. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve for the month of April the Documentary Stamp Tax, co shr in the amount of \$1,551.38; County Clerk fees in the amount of \$2,547.57; P&M Fund fees in the amount of \$383.00; Misc Copy fees in the amount of \$0.00; Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$97.64; Passport fees in the amount of \$140.00; County Treasurer's receipt of money received numbered 25385 – 25474, inclusive in the amount of \$930,348.21 County Sheriff's 4th Qu 2025 report; and place them on file. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Kment to approve the following Accounts Payable claims as presented, except to change the claim of Point C in the amount of \$228.00 and approve the Payroll claims as presented and order checks drawn on the various funds.
