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**COMMISSIONER’S PROCEEDINGS – May 18, 2026**

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Stanton County, Nebraska was held in an open and public session on May 18, 2026, at 8:15 AM in the County Commissioner’s room in Stanton, Nebraska.

Present upon the roll call were Douglas Huttman, Dennis Kment and Douglas Oertwich, Board of Commissioners. Wanda Heermann, County Clerk, was also present.

Advance notice of the meeting was given by publication in the Stanton Register on May 6, 2026, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes, and by posting on the county website.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance to the Board members, a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda being attached to these minutes.

All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America the meeting was called to order at 8:15 AM by Chairman Kment, who announced that the open meetings act is posted on the wall in the Commissioner’s room and a copy may be obtained from the County Clerk’s office upon request.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve the agenda. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve the minutes of the April 20, 2026, meeting. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The following correspondence was reviewed and placed on file: NNSWC – Landfill Site Observations; Auction Time – proceeds sale surplus equipment; US Cellular/T-Mobile – transition letter.

W. Bert Lammler, county attorney, joined the meeting.

A discussion was held on the NACO Health Insurance Pool with Blue Cross Blue Shield letter of April 28, 2026. The NACO Board of Directors has made a final determination that the Stanton County medical 2026-2027 plan year rates will have an increase of 4.68% for health insurance. Being part of the NACO pool allows counties to accumulate the risk together as a group. The new rates effective July 1, 2026, will be \$1,081.95 for an employee only plan, \$2,171.96 for an employee/spouse or employee/child plan and \$2,484.86 for an employee/family plan. The county currently pays for full family insurance, which is a benefit to the employees. There will be no change to the current county deductible with this renewal. The deductible will remain \$3,500.00 employee/\$7,000.00 family. Also discussed was the current HRA contribution of \$2,500.00 per employee for assistance with the health insurance deductible and other medical costs.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to proceed with the renewal of the county health insurance with NACO BCBS \$3,500.00 QHDHP Plan effective July 1, 2026 and that the county will continue to pay full family insurance for employees and will continue the current HRA \$2,500.00 contribution per employee enrolled in the county health plan to assist with the insurance deductible and other medical costs, and authorize the county clerk to sign the BCBS subgroup application. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Discussion was held on the current cash-in-lieu of insurance buyout option. Stanton County employees can elect to receive a buyout option of their current premium in lieu of health care benefits at a percentage set by the county board. The buyout option will be adjusted as the county health insurance premiums increase or decrease.

Motion made by Kment, seconded by Huttman to continue to offer cash in lieu of insurance at the rate of 60% of the premium rates effective July 1, 2026. Voting: Ayes: Kment, Huttman and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

A discussion was held on the 2026-2027 Budget. The county clerk advised the county board that the State Auditor's office has not completed the revised budget documents for the FY 2026-2027 with the new legislative changes. The county board stated the county departments should remain within a 2% increase when considering their department budgets for the upcoming fiscal year. A discussion was held on the appointment of the budget making authority for the next fiscal year.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to appoint Wanda Heermann, Stanton County Clerk, as the budget making authority for the fiscal year 2026-2027 budget. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The Special Designated Liquor License applications of Greg Ptacek on behalf of Johnnie Byrd Brewing Company of Wayne NE were reviewed. The intent of the licenses for Johnnie Byrd Brewing Company is to have a small beer garden which will serve beer and mixed drinks during the Windmill Market events scheduled on June 27, 2026, July 25, 2026, August 29, 2026, and September 26, 2026, between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM. Location of the Windmill Market is 57041 US Hwy 275, Pilger NE. The county sheriff indicated he did not have an issue with the issuance of the SDL licenses but noted that all liquor laws will be strictly enforced if any violations are reported or observed by law enforcement.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve the Special Designated Liquor License applications of Greg Ptacek on behalf of Johnnie Byrd Brewing Company of Wayne NE to have a small beer garden which will serve beer and mixed drinks during the Windmill Market events scheduled on June 27, 2026, July 25, 2026, August 29, 2026, and September 26, 2026 between the hours of 9:00 AM and 4:00 PM, located at 57041 US Hwy 275, Pilger NE. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mike Unger, county sheriff, appeared before the county board. A discussion was held on the law enforcement city contract, employee turnover, overtime and parttime work, 2026-2027 budget restricted to 2% lid, surplus vehicles and equipment and continuing education hours required. No action needed by the county board.

Kylee Klug, Planning and Zoning Administrator, joined the meeting. Kylee presented the Marvin F. Stender's Lot Split splitting property located in the NW NW 10-21-1 into 2 lots. Trevor Turner, representative of Stanton PPD, appeared for the lot split. Kylee explained that lot 1 will consist of 4.04 acres and is to be transferred to the Stanton County Public Power District for a substation. She explained that this would typically be considered an unbuildable lot since it does not meet the 5 acre requirement in the Primary Ag zoning district, however, since the lot is going to be utilized by the Public Power District they do not have to comply with the lot size requirements. There are currently no utilities located on the property.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Kment to approve the Marvin F. Stender's Lot Split splitting property located in the NW NW 10-21-1 into two lots, as per the Planning Commission recommendations. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Kment and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Shelli Meyer, BOLD Nebraska, appeared before the county board to discuss carbon pipelines. Ms. Meyer presented updates on the routes through Iowa, Nebraska, South Dakota and North Dakota as well as if permits were allowed or no longer allowed. Also discussed was Federal Legislation, PHMSA (Pipeline & Hazardous Materials Safety Administration), County Board roles, Strategy/Possibilities on a different route across Nebraska, and issues for landowners unable to obtain insurance for property with a pipeline. This was a general discussion, no action was needed or taken by the county board.

Ramsy Robertson, representative of Mainelli Wagner Assoc, joined the meeting.

The chairman opened the hearing at 10:05 AM to receive input regarding the sale of county owned real estate described as: East One acre of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 3 East of the 6<sup>th</sup> P.M., Stanton County, Nebraska (Parcel No. 0002748.00, Kingsburg Precinct). Leonard Jindra appeared for the hearing. A discussion was held with those present on the reason to sell the property.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to close the hearing. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to set this property for sale by sealed bids on June 15, 2026, at 10:00AM, publish Notice to Bidders, and mail a copy of the notice to abutting landowners. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Ramsy informed the county board that a road study had been completed on Rd. 149 located in the middle of the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 16-22-2 south one-half mile from the north section line and Rd. 55 located between the NE $\frac{1}{4}$  and SE $\frac{1}{4}$  of section 16-22-2 west one-quarter mile from the east section line (Butterfly Precinct). Ramsy stated that an easement was filed April 16, 2026. A copy of the road study was not given to the county board. This report will need to be received prior to setting up a road hearing.

The county board reviewed the resolution for the Interlocal Agreement between Madison County and Stanton County for the 2026 Madison and Stanton Armor Coat project. The Stanton County project is Golf Course Road between Highway 57 and Highway 15.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve Resolution No. 2026.05-11 for the Interlocal Agreement between Madison County and Stanton County for the 2026 Madison and Stanton Armor Coat project. Stanton County project is Golf Course Road between Highway 57 and Highway 15. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried. [Interlocal Agreement on file County Clerk's office].

A discussion was held on the engineers estimate for a three span 130'-0" continuous concrete slab bridge, Project: C008411425, C-84(259) located 840 Rd west 569 Ave (35-24-3 / 2-23-2). The estimated cost is \$1,151,080.00.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to set the bid letting estimate for a three span 130'-0" continuous concrete slab bridge, Project: C008411425, C-84(259) located 840 Rd west 569 Ave (35-24-2 / 2-23-2) for July 20, 2026, at 10:45 AM. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way received from LTS Managed Technical Services LLC to install buried fiber optic cable starting 2 miles east of Hwy 15 on 843 Rd then north along 574 Ave to the Stanton/Wayne Countyline – located in the northeast sections of Pilger Precinct. Ramsy informed the county board that the permit was reviewed, and the placement of the fiber cable will be within the right-of-way via boring and trenching.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve Utility Permit No. 20260518-1 received from LTS Managed Technical Services LLC to install buried fiber optic cable starting 2 miles east of Hwy 15 on 843 Rd then north along 574 Ave to the Stanton/Wayne Countyline – located in the northeast sections of Pilger Precinct; subject to the requirements and provisions of the permit and with the following conditions: : 1) only allows authority on Stanton County ROW; 2) permit contingent on requirements listed in Appendix "A": (a) all fees need to be paid prior to the issuance of the permit (\$500); 3) the fiber line needs to be placed as far away as possible from the road, not placed in any road; 4) all roads and/or culverts are to be bored under, not cut through; 5) the fiber line should be 4' (four feet)

below the surface and 4' (four feet) below any culvert; 6) all roads need to be returned to their original condition if damaged or the cost for repair to fix the damages will be billed to the applicant; 7) if additional gravel is needed after construction the costs will be charged to the applicant; and 8) contact Darrell Hansen, bridge foreman, prior to beginning to be certain all culverts have been flagged and with any questions, or concerns. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way received from Viaero Fiber Networks LLC to install fiber optic. The permit did not indicate the legal descriptions (section, township, range or road number, etc) for the site area. The county clerk requested additional information for the legal descriptions and requested they revise their permit to indicate that the fiber optic cannot be installed within the road or at the edge of the road and that all utilities need to be placed in the right-of-way away from the edge of the roadway. Additional information requested was not received prior to the board meeting.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to table the Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way received from Viaero Fiber Networks LLC to install fiber optic because additional information was not received. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the gravel contracts received from Backus Sand & Gravel of McLean and Matteo Sand & Gravel of Norfolk.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve and sign the gravel contracts received from Backus Sand & Gravel of McLean and Matteo Sand & Gravel of Norfolk. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The chairman opened the hearing at 11:00 AM on the One and Six Year Plan for highway improvements for Stanton County. Notice of the Public Hearing was published in the Stanton Register May 6 and 13, 2026, and posted April 30, 2026, at three (3) public places: Stanton County Courthouse, SID No. 1 Office, Norfolk and Cooper Community Center, Pilger.

The 2026-2031 One and Six Year Plan was reviewed. No one appeared for the hearing. Discussion was held on road projects and bridge projects contained in the plan. No public comments were received.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to close the One and Six Year Plan hearing at 11:20 AM. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve Resolution No. 2026.05-12 to adopt the One and Six Year Plan for Highway Improvements. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The board reviewed the State and Local Fiscal Recovery Funds (SLFRF), a/k/a ARPA Funds, reporting requirement. The first annual submission report of March 31, 2022, was submitted with no obligations or funds spent. The second annual submission report of March 31, 2023, contained five (5) projects approved and funds disbursed in the amount of \$460,081.56 and was filed April 21, 2023. The third annual submission report of March 31, 2024, containing seven (7) projects approved and funds disbursed in the amount of \$484,638.39 was filed April 25, 2024. The fourth annual submission report of March 31, 2025, containing two (2) projects approved and funds disbursed in the amount of \$92,583.00 was filed April 30, 2025. The fifth annual submission report of March 31, 2026, containing three (3) projects approved and funds disbursed in the amount of \$112,588.05 was filed April 21, 2026. The Stanton County allotment of \$1,149,891.00 had been disbursed prior to June 30, 2025. The interest earned in the amount of \$23,360.73 was transferred to the general fund through the claim process on September 15, 2025.

Leonard Jindra appeared before the county board to voice concerns about the Conditional Use Permit application of KGI Wireless on behalf of Verizon Wireless to erect a telecommunications tower on property located in the S½ SE 14-23-3 approved at the April 20, 2026, county board meeting. Mr. Jindra stated a hazard at night when repairing their irrigation pump, claiming the lights from the tower would be flashing in their eyes causing a distraction. The county board listened to his concerns. No action taken by the county board.

Mike Frohberg, emergency manager, joined the meeting.

Kylee Klug, safety committee member, rejoined the meeting. Kylee informed the county board of CPR certifications for new and current employees (new/refresh), job description and duties, and tobacco use in county owned vehicles. It was noted that no reports or claims have been filed since the last meeting held in February.

Mike Frohberg, emergency manager, introduced the summer intern, Jordan Howell, to the county board. Jordan will assist in updating the 2026 LEOP, organize and update agency records, assist with summer storm spotting coordination and documentation, provide general clerical and administrative support. The internship is a temporary part-time position beginning May 19, 2026, to July 31, 2026. The county board approved the internship position at their February 17, 2026, meeting.

Motion made by Huttman, seconded by Oertwich to approve for the month of May the Documentary Stamp Tax, co shr in the amount of \$3,791.70; County Clerk fees in the amount of \$3,896.59; P&M Fund fees in the amount of \$481.50; Misc Copy fees in the amount of \$0.00; Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$350.26; Passport fees in the amount of \$35.00; County Treasurer's receipt of money received numbered 25475 – 25538, inclusive in the amount of \$3,889,682.80; County Treasurer's List Distress Warrants issued October 31, 2025 and returned from County Sheriff; County Sheriff List Distress Warrants paid October 31, 2025 to October 2026; County VSO 2025-2026 3<sup>rd</sup> Qu Report; and place them on file. Voting: Ayes: Huttman, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to approve the following Accounts Payable claims as presented, except to change the claim of Kim Bearnes to the amount of \$73.45 and approve the Payroll claims as presented and order checks drawn on the various funds.
