Notice of the meeting was given in advance to the Board members, a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda being attached to these minutes.

All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public.

The meeting was called to order at 8:00 AM by Chairman Kment, who announced that the open meetings act is posted on the wall in the commissioner’s room and a copy may be obtained from the county clerk’s office upon request.

Cory Locke, deputy county attorney, joined the meeting.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Kment to approve the agenda. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Absent: Huttman. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Kment, seconded by Oertwich to approve the minutes of the May 18, 2026, meeting. Voting: Ayes: Kment and Oertwich. Nays: None. Absent: Huttman. Motion Carried.

Amber Happold, county assessor, presented and explained the correction sheets for the month.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Kment to approve and authorize the chairman to sign the correction sheets numbered 295 (2024) and 296 (2025) and place them on file. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Absent: Huttman. Motion Carried.

Amber presented the Notice of Rejection of Homestead Exemption (Form 458R). Discussion was held on the reasons to deny the homestead exemption application.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Kment to deny the homestead exemption application for real property located in Lots 1,2,3,4,5,6,7,8,9 & 10 of Block 2, Graves Addition to the City of Stanton, because the applicant does not own the home and does not occupy the home. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Absent: Huttman. Motion Carried.

Doug Huttman joined the meeting at 8:10 AM.

There were no listings of clerical errors needing approval.

Amber presented a list of over/under valued property within Stanton County. She explained the updates and/or changes to the listed properties.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Kment to approve the list of over/under valued property and allow the County Assessor to adjust the tax rolls. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Kment and Huttman. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The following correspondence was reviewed and placed on file: Amended Order Vacating Single Commissioners Decision and Order for Hearing and Notice of Hearing – 24R 0737.

The county board reviewed the Findings and Orders document received from the Nebraska Tax Equalization and Review Commission and placed it on file. The Nebraska Tax Equalization and Review Commission finds that no order proposing an adjustment of the value for a class or subclass of real property in Stanton County for the tax year 2026 shall be entered and no further proceedings shall be held to determine whether an adjustment should be made. The order is effective May 15, 2026.

The county board reviewed the County Assessor’s Certification that the Assessment Rolls for the Real Property in Stanton County have been completed by her office for the year 2026 and placed it on file.

Discussion was held on possible hearing dates for property valuation protest hearings. Protest hearings will be set for July 7, 2026, beginning at 8:30 AM and if needed additional dates of July 8 & 9, 2026.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttman to adjourn to July 7, 2026, at 8:00 AM and set the next meeting for July 20, 2026, at 8:00 AM. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttman and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

COMMISSIONER’S PROCEEDINGS – June 15, 2026

A meeting of the Board of Commissioners of Stanton County, Nebraska was held in an open and public session on June 15, 2026, at 8:15 AM in the County Commissioner’s room in Stanton, Nebraska.

Present upon the roll call were Douglas Huttman, Dennis Kment and Douglas Oertwich, Board of Commissioners. Wanda Heermann, County Clerk, was also present.

Advance notice of the meeting was given by publication in the Stanton Register on June 3, 2026, a copy of the proof of publication being attached to these minutes, and by posting on the county website.

Notice of the meeting was given in advance to the Board members, a copy of their acknowledgement of the receipt of notice and the agenda being attached to these minutes.

All proceedings hereinafter shown were taken while the convened meeting was open to the attendance of the public

Following the Pledge of Allegiance to the flag of the United States of America the meeting was called to order at 8:20 AM by Chairman Kment, who announced that the open meetings act is posted on the wall in the Commissioner’s room and a copy may be obtained from the County Clerk’s office upon request.

Joining the meeting were: Amber Happold, county assessor, Sandy Zoubek, county treasurer, Cory Locke, deputy county attorney and Tyler Evans, deputy sheriff.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to approve the agenda. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Kment to approve the minutes of the May 18, 2026, meeting. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Kment and Huttmann. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The following correspondence was reviewed and placed on file: NNSWC – landfill site observation June 5, 2026.

Amber presented a contract for appraisal services between the Stanton County Assessor and Central Plains Valuation LLC. Amber explained the contract was for the maintenance program for referee work for protested values. The contractor shall begin the work when agreed to by the County and the Contractor. The contractor shall complete its performance on or before July 25, 2026.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to approve and authorize the chairman to sign the Central Plains Valuation LLC contract for maintenance program as referee work for protested values. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried. [copy of Contract on file in County Clerk’s office].

Discussion was held on the printing and mailing of the joint public hearing (JPH) postcards. The county board needs to designate a vendor for the printing of the postcards. The assessor’s office will be using the MIPS software for printing the electronic files and NACO will be partnering with the State Print Shop and Pitney Bowes for printing and mailing the JPH postcards.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to designate the State Print Shop and Pitney Bowes as the printing vendor for MIPS/NACO to generate the joint public hearing postcards. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Discussion was held on the MDT LLC (Certified Public Accountants) proposal for the audit of Stanton County for the year ending June 30, 2026. Three year proposals will no longer be submitted due to the economic uncertainties therefore audits will be proposed on a year-to-year basis. The proposed audit fee is not to exceed \$17,000 for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2026, and if the audit is subject to Uniform Guidance (OMB Circular A-133) there would be an additional charge of \$6,750.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to accept the proposal submitted by MDT LLC for the FY June 30, 2026, audit. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the NACO Section 125 plan re-enrollment notice received from First Concord Benefits Group. For 2026 the IRS has announced an increase to the flexible healthcare spending account. The annual limit increased to \$3,400.00. A discussion was held on the plan.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to increase the FSA maximum annual limit to \$3,400.00 as per the IRS index amount. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

W. Bert Lamml, county attorney, joined the meeting.

Sandy Zoubek, county treasurer, appeared to discuss the possible placement of an ATM machine within the courthouse. A discussion was held on the use. Sandy advised the county board that she would talk to local banking facilities about the process. No action taken by the county board.

The county board acknowledged the filing of a Tort Claim on June 1, 2026.

Derek Bosler, deputy sheriff, appeared before the county board with a request to establish a K-9 Unit (single purpose canine). Derek stated that a canine can help locate illegal narcotics, track evidence or suspects, if needed. The cost of a canine is estimated to be between \$10,500 to \$12,500 depending on availability. Additional costs to be considered are handler pay (payable through the general payroll expenses); initial training and other training requirements; ongoing veterinary care; food, daily care and other needs for the canine; and canine equipment and vehicle modifications. A discussion was held on whether there would be additional liability insurance required. Also discussed was the funding for the K-9 Unit through donations, grants (if available) and continuing with fundraising efforts to ensure that county funds will not be needed through property taxes. Deputy Bosler indicated he would be asking for donations to cover the initial costs between \$30,000 to \$40,000 to establish the fund and receive ongoing donations to sustain the K-9 Unit. The community impact and outreach of a K-9 Unit will have engagement in drug prevention education through school events or demonstrations, K-9 demonstrations at local community events and public safety would be improved because of the presence of a K-9 Unit which can discourage criminal activity.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann that any donations received for the K-9 Fund prior to the 2026-2027 fiscal year budget be deposited into the general fund for future transfer to the new K-9 Fund (2430-650) that will be established by resolution at the July 20, 2026, county board meeting. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Kylee Klug, Planning and Zoning Administrator, and Ramsy Robertson, representative of Mainelli Wagner Assoc, joined the meeting.

The chairman opened the hearing at 9:45 AM on the Conditional Use Permit application of Grinnell Group obo Vertical Bridge and Verizon Wireless to erect a telecommunication tower on property located in the NE 6-21-3. Darren Hunter, representative of Grinnell Group, appeared for the hearing. Kylee explained the application, indicated lighting is required by the FAA, the height of the tower is 310’, tower guidelines and setbacks have been met, and easements have already been filed. The conditions recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission were reviewed with Kylee and Darren Hunter.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to close the hearing. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to approve the Conditional Use Permit application of Grinnell Group obo Vertical Bridge and Verizon Wireless to erect a telecommunication tower on property located in the NE 6-21-3, as per Planning Commission recommendations. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Kylee presented the Denney’s Lot Split splitting property located in Pt 18-23-3 into 4 lots. Kylee explained that lot 1 consists of 7.93 acres located in the middle of the other lots; the driveway is included in lot 1 and proceeds north to lot 2, included with the survey is an egress/ingress easement across lot 1 to lot 2. The remaining lots included on the survey have direct road access. Discussion was held on the well locations and future use of the property.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to approve the Denney’s Lot Split splitting property located in Pt 18-23-3 into 4 lots, as per Planning Commission recommendations. Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Bid Letting for the sale of the East One acre of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 3 East of the 6th P.M., Stanton County, Nebraska (Parcel No. 0002748.00, Kingsburg Precinct) county owned real estate was held at 10:00 AM. No one appeared. The chairman opened the sealed bid received and read it aloud from Kevin Koenig of Koenig Enterprises obo of Kuehl Brothers LLC in the amount of \$2,000.00.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to accept the bid received from Kevin Koenig of Koenig Enterprises obo of Kuehl Brothers LLC in the amount of \$2,000.00 for the purchase of the East One acre of the West Half of the Southwest Quarter of Section 24, Township 23 North, Range 3 East of the 6th P.M., Stanton County, Nebraska (Parcel No. 0002748.00, Kingsburg Precinct). Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the NIRMA/NIRMA II Renewal Billing for July 1, 2026 to June 30, 2027. Discussion was held on the premium decrease and current deductible amounts.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to continue insurance coverage through NIRMA/NIRMA II with the current deductible amounts for the July 1, 2026, to June 30, 2027, coverage period. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the Permit to Construct Utilities on County Right-of-Way received from Viaero Fiber Networks LLC to install buried fiber optic cable from the Stanton County line on Eisenhower Ave, then east to State Hwy 35, then start again at the end of State Hwy 35 on Eastwood St, then North to 846 Rd, and then east to 561 Ave in sections 4,5,7,18-24-1 located in Spring Branch Precinct which was tabled at the May 18, 2026, meeting. Ramsy informed the county board that the permit was reviewed, and the placement of the fiber cable will be within the right-of-way via boring and trenching.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to approve Utility Permit No. 20260615-1 received from Viaero Fiber Networks LLC to install buried fiber optic cable from the Stanton County line on Eisenhower Ave, then east to State Hwy 35, then start again at the end of State Hwy 35 on Eastwood St, then North to 846 Rd, and then east to 561 Ave in sections 4,5,7,18-24-1 located in Spring Branch Precinct; subject to the requirements and provisions of the permit and with the following conditions: 1) only allows authority on Stanton County ROW; 2) permit contingent on requirements listed in Appendix "A": (a) all fees need to be paid prior to the issuance of the permit (\$650); 3) the fiber line needs to be placed as far away as possible from the road, not placed in any road; 4) all roads and/or culverts are to be bored under, not cut through; 5) the fiber line should be 4' (four feet) below the surface and 4' (four feet) below any culvert; 6) all roads need to be returned to their original condition if damaged or the cost for repair to fix the damages will be billed to the applicant; 7) if additional gravel is needed after construction the costs will be charged to the applicant; and 8) contact Darrell Hansen, bridge foreman, prior to beginning to be certain all culverts have been flagged and with any questions, or concerns. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

The county board reviewed the road study of Road 149 located in the middle of the NE¼ of section 16-22-2 south one-half mile from the north section line and Road 55 located between the NE¼ and SE¼ of section 16-22-2 west one-quarter mile from the east section line (Butterfly Precinct) received from Mainelli Wagner and Associates. Mainelli Wagner & Associates were directed to make a study of the use being made of said road. According to Nebraska State Statute, prior to taking action to vacate or close a county road the County Board shall conduct a public hearing to receive input.

Motion made by Oertwich, seconded by Huttmann to approve the Resolution No. 2026.06-13 to schedule a public hearing on vacation or closure of a county road Road 149 located in the middle of the NE¼ of section 16-22-2 south one-half mile from the north section line and Road 55 located between the NE¼ and SE¼ of section 16-22-2 west one-quarter mile from the east section line (Butterfly Precinct). Voting: Ayes: Oertwich, Huttmann and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Doug Hart presented results of a road study conducted on Old Hwy 8. Result sheets given to Ramsy to analysis.

Mike Unger, county sheriff, appeared before the county board to discuss LB784 approved by the Governor. The passage of LB784 (effective July 18, 2026) will allow an elected sheriff to reside in an adjoining county, given that the county does not contain a city of a metropolitan, primary, or first class. Mike wanted to inform the county board of his intention to reside outside of Stanton county prior to the end of his term. No action needed by the county board.

Mike Frohberg, emergency manager, joined the meeting.

A discussion was held on a possible interlocal agreement with Cuming County to collaborate emergency management services between Stanton County and Cuming County. Details to be discussed are the services needed, operational expectations, and funding considerations. It was discussed to set up an advisory committee of two members to assist the emergency manager.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Kment to appoint Douglas Oertwich, commissioner, and Tyler Evans, deputy sheriff, to serve on the advisory committee with Mike Frohberg. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Kment and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mike advised the county board that Stanton County was awarded \$38,000 from the Jack Lewis Safety Grant to upfit a new vehicle. A discussion was held on the purchase of a new Chev Tahoe and the trade-in of the Dodge Durango in the 2026-2027 budget.

A discussion was held on the Pilger Shop pickups that need to be replaced. Current pickups both have over 200,000 miles and are showing signs of rust and could be sold at auction. Mike presented a 2017 Chev Silverado 1500 4x4 4dr for \$20,500 available on the Nebraska Federal Surplus website.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to authorize Mike to proceed with the purchase of the 2017 Chev Silverado 1500 4x4 in the amount of \$20,500 from Nebraska Federal Surplus. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Mike Unger, county sheriff, and Derek Bosler and Tyler Evans, deputy sheriffs, joined the meeting to discuss new body cameras for the sheriff's department. The current cameras are aging and cannot be operated an entire shift before the batteries are depleted. There are no grants available until after the end of the year, but any future grants does not guarantee being awarded. There are funds available in the sheriff sinking fund which could be used to purchase 7 to 8 new body cameras and batteries. An invoice will be submitted before the conclusion of the county board meeting for payment of the cameras in the 2025-2026 budget year.

General discussion was held on the 2026-2027 budget to continue with allotting funds to the Stanton Library and Pilger Library, road projects and department increases.

Motion made by Kment, seconded by Huttmann to approve for the month of May the Documentary Stamp Tax, co shr in the amount of \$556.96; County Clerk fees in the amount of \$2,770.75; P&M Fund fees in the amount of \$389.50; Misc Copy fees in the amount of \$0.00; Clerk of the District Court fees in the amount of \$75.79; Passport fees in the amount of \$00.00; County Treasurer's receipt of money received numbered 25539 – 25600, inclusive in the amount of \$1,233,920.27; and place them on file. Voting: Ayes: Kment, Huttmann and Oertwich. Nays: None. Motion Carried.

Motion made by Huttmann, seconded by Oertwich to approve the following Accounts Payable claims as presented, except to change the claim of Pilger Store to the amount of \$18,618.39, add a claim for Frohberg Electric in the amount of \$675.22, add a claim for Brite in the amount of \$32,633.00 and add a claim for Nebraska Federal Surplus in the amount of \$20,500.00 and approve the Payroll claims as presented and order checks drawn on the various funds. Voting: Ayes: Huttmann, Oertwich and Kment. Nays: None. Motion Carried.
